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### Section VI: HEALTH HAZARDS

*Emergency First Aid:*

**Skin:** Remove contaminated clothing. Wash affected area with soap and water.

**Eyes:** Thoroughly flush eyes with water. Contact a physician if irritation persist.

**Ingestion:** Rinse mouth with water, provided person is conscious and contact a physician.

**Inhalation:** Remove person to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration and contact physician.

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### Section VII: SAFE HANDLING

*Chemical Release or Spill:* Isolate the spill area with sand, or other absorbent material. Place all contaminated material in a closed container for disposal. Neutralize with dilute acetic acid

*Waste Disposal Method:* All liquid and or contaminated material should be disposed of in DOT approved waste containers. Comply with all Federal, State and Local regulations for disposal.

*Precautions for Handling and Storing:* Use normal precautions for corrosive liquids. Avoid excessive heat.
